



Honorary Membership

Honorary Membership is awarded to reflect the outstanding contribution of an exceptional individual to furthering the charitable aims of UKELA;

More particularly, Honorary Membership may be awarded by Council to such exceptional individuals who have distinguished themselves in the fields of:

- (a) outstanding teaching of environmental law;
- (b) outstanding practice of environmental law;
- (c) or any other outstanding contribution which is connected to the furtherance of the aims and / or development of UKELA.

The process for nominating individuals for Honorary Membership is for a nomination, supported by at least a current or former member of UKELA's Council of Management, to be presented at the first meeting of the Council in the calendar year.

Each nomination should be supported by a case outlining the suitability of the nominee for Honorary membership. This should be sufficiently comprehensive to allow the Council to make an informed decision on whether to award Honorary Membership.

Honorary Membership will be awarded following consideration of such nominations from UKELA members if there is unanimous support at the Council Meeting in question.

Successful candidates (if any) will generally be awarded Honorary Membership at UKELA's Annual Conference.

It is expected that Honorary Membership will be awarded sparingly. Council may make no awards or multiple awards, depending on the nominations received.

The process would be gathering of candidates' names over the year, discussion and approval of candidates as they arise and award of HM at the annual conference.
