- September 2016 – submission to House of Commons Energy and Climate Change Committee inquiry on ‘Leaving the EU: implications for energy policy’
- October 2016 – Professor Richard Macrory gave oral evidence to the House of Lords EU Energy and Environment Sub-Committee inquiry exploring the future of environment and climate change policy following the vote to leave the European Union
- Ongoing – submission to Environmental Audit Committee's new inquiry into the Future of Chemicals Regulation after the EU Referendum (particular focus on REACH)
